





# व्यापार के साथ-साथ चुनावों का सटीक विश्लेषण ही पहचान समाज सेवा के क्षेत्र में अग्रणी पुखराज चौपड़ा

कानेर की धरा पर ऐसे-ऐसे लोगों ने जन्म लिया है जिनकी बजह से बीकानेर का नाम रोशन हुआ है। अपने-अपने क्षेत्र में इन लोगों ने अपना तथा शहर का नाम रोशन किया है। चाहे खेल, साहित्य हो अथवा व्यापार का क्षेत्र हो। कोई भी ऐसा क्षेत्र नहीं है जिसमें यहां के लोगों ने अपनी पहचान न बना पाई हो। जब चुनाव होते हैं तो यहां के विश्लेषण को लोग सटीक मानते हैं और कई तरह की बहस भी होती रहती है। अगर व्यापार और समाज सेवा की बात करे तो यहां के लोगों ने अपना नाम कमाया है। व्यापार तथा समाज सेवा में गंगाशहर क्षेत्र के लोगों की अग्रणी चृमिका है। इसी क्षेत्र के निवासी पुखराज चौपड़ा ने भी व्यापार, समाजसेवा और चुनावों में सटीक विश्लेषण कर अपनी पहचान बनाई है। चीपड़ा ने जब से होश संभाला था तभी से ही व्यापार क्षेत्र में कदम रख दिया था। इसके बाद उन्होंने पीछे मृह कर नहीं देखा। उन्होंने 1969 में पटसन के पृश्तेनी व्यापार में असम रहे। व्यापार के सिलसिले में वे बंगाल, उडीसा और बिहार भी आना जाना रहता था। वे इन राज्यों में बडे-बडे व्यापारियों से मिलते और व्यापार को आगे बढ़ाने में गहन चर्चा करते थे। यहां पर उन्होंने पेर जमाने शुरू किए थे। लेकिन

1980 में बीकानेर में उनके बड़े भाई साहब के बीमार हो गए थे। इस वजह से उन्हें बीकानेर अकर अपने अनाज व्यवसाय में जुड़ गए। उन्होंने पैसा कमाने का शौंक कम मा और लोगों से संपर्क करने का शौंक अधिक था।

इमरजेंसी के बाद हुए विधानसभा चुनावों में वे सबिम रूप से चर्चां करते ये और आज भी जारी है। चुनावों में मतो का आकलन करने का शौक भी तब से लंकर आज तक है जिसे आज सेफॉलोजी कहते हैं। इस शौक के चलते राजस्थान के अलावा बिहार और दिल्ली तक जाकर चुनावी माहौल से रुबर होते थे। इस दौरान वे कई चैनल में चर्चा करते और प्रत्याशी की हार-जीत के कारणों का एक-एक पहलू सामने

रखते थे। बीकानेर आने के बाद चौपड़ा 1995 में बीकानेर अनाज कमेटी के अध्यक्ष भी रहें। अपने अध्यक्ष कार्यालय के दौरान उन्होंने ब्यापारियों की प्रमुख समस्याओं को सरकार के समक्ष रखा और उनका निराकरण कराने में कई बार



सरकार से चर्चा भी करते। इसके अलावा 1985 से 2000 तक राजस्थान खाद्य व्यापार संघ के उपाध्यक्ष पद की जिम्मेदारी भी सफलतापुँक निभाई थी। इसके अलावा वे कई संस्थाओं मे महत्वपूर्ण पदो पर भी रहे। नेशनल हाँकी के प्रचार मंत्री, बेटरन एथेलेटिक के अध्यक्ष और प्रदेश उपाध्यक्ष के अलावा आचार्य तुलसी समाधि स्थल का सहमंत्री आचार्य तुलसी महाप्रज चातुर्मास में शहर सीन्दर्यकरण का प्रभारी, नई लेन ओसवाल पंचायती का ट्रस्टी, बीकानेर व्यापार उद्योग महल में उपाध्यक्ष और प्रवक्ता तथा कृषि उपज मंडी में राजस्थान सरकार द्वारा सलाहकार पद का जिम्मेदारी भी निभाई थी। इसके अलावा शहर भाजपा की कार्यकारियां उपाध्यक्ष भी रहे।

# RTGS to settle transactions in global currencies soon: RBI Guv

Informist NEW DELHI

India could leverage its 24X7 real-time gross settlement system and explore the feasibility of using the system to smoothen cross-border trade with various major trade partners, Reserve Bank of India Governor Shaktikanta Das said Monday.

"The feasibility of expanding RTGS to settle transactions in major trade currencies such as the dollar, the euro and the Great Britain Pound (sterling) can be explored through bilateral or multilateral agreements," Das said at the "Central Banking at Crossroads" event in New Delhi.

Such measures offer immense scope in reducing the cost and time taken for remittances, key for emerging market economies like India,



the RBI governor said.
Remittances offer a starting
point to develop peer-to-peer
payment solutions, he said.
India has already signed bilateral agreements with countries such as Singapore, France
and the United Arab Emirates
on linking its Unified
Payments Interface with systems in those countries. It is
also a part of Project Nexus, a
multilateral initiative to enable
cross-border retail payments

by interlinking domestic instant payment systems of four south-east Asian nations and India.

India's highly developed digital public infrastructure has led to the development of various cutting edge financial products that have the potential for cross-border payments, Das said.

According to the RBI governor, India's experience can be leveraged by other countries to usher in a "global digital revolution." UPI owneroperator National Payments Corp. of India's international arm has signed agreements with various frontier economies, most recently Trinidad and Tobago, for a UPI-like payments system.

Another key innovation was central bank digital currencies, which could make these payments much easier, Das said.

- **Provide benefits and subsidies**: The policy will make benefits and subsidies available to the retail industry, similar to those available to micro, small, and medium enterprises.
- Address concerns: The policy will be comprehensive and address the concerns of stakeholders.

The retail trade sector is governed by several laws in India, including the Shops and Establishment Act, Consumer Protection Act, Legal Metrology Act, Food Safety Act, and Essential Commodities Act.

Pesticides are still the main reason for the rejection of spices and herbs



Although the number of reported pesticide issues slightly decreased in 2023, it remains high. In 2023, the European Commission reported 248 problems with spices and herbs, a slight increase from 2022. Pesticides remained the most common issue, followed by salmonella.

# The number of pesticide issues is still high

The Rapid Alert System for Food and Feed (RASFF) reports non-compliance with European food legislation. The problem divisions for spices, herbs and spice mixes are as follows:

- 42% pesticides;
- 19% microbiological issues;
- 12 % mycotoxins; and

11% plant toxins (11%).

# The top 3 used pesticides

- 1. 25% of all pesticide issues relate to Ethylene Oxide (EtO), a colourless gas banned in the European Union (EU). Exporters to the European market must treat spices with alternative methods or fumigation agents. Heat treatment, for example, can reduce the risk of insect contamination.
- 2. The insecticide Chlorpyrifos is the second most common pesticide, and the EU banned it in early 2020.
- 3. Third is the 'cocktail' category (21% of the total), which refers to all pesticide blends of at least 2 different types.

# Plant toxins in the European Union

Since December 2020, there have been rules on how much pyrrolizidine alkaloids (plant toxins) the EU allows in certain food products:

- For most dried herbs and cumin seeds, the limit is 400 micrograms per kilogram.
- For (mixes of) borage, lovage, marjoram, and oregano, the limit is higher at 1,000 micrograms per kilogram.

Cumin exports from Turkey to Europe face challenges in particular. The reported issues grew from 8 in 2022 to 13 in 2023, causing an 80% growth in 1 year.

# The big 5: India, Brazil, Turkey, Egypt and Indonesia

A deep dive into the RASFF database shows that 5 countries contribute substantially to the total number of issues.

- India contributed with 58 issues in 2023, up from 53 in 2022. Almost 80% of these cases involved exceeding the maximum residue levels (MRLs) for pesticides.
- Turkey had 38 issues in 2023, up from 17 in 2022. Most reports are about problems with:
  - 1. Plant toxins (cumin);
  - 2. Pesticides;
  - 3. Mycotoxins; and
  - 4. Salmonella.
- Brazil has a reputation for salmonella-contaminated black pepper. Black pepper production in Brazil often takes place on small family farms, where farmers dry pepper in the open air. Open-air drying has a high risk of salmonella contamination from animals and birds. The number of salmonella issues went down drastically from 45 in 2022 to 20 in 2023. But, this was mostly due to a 36% lower export volume to Germany, which has always been the leading country reporting these issues in RASFF.
- Egypt and Indonesia are very close in terms of issues reported in RASFF. They both had 10 issues in 2022 and rose to 18 and 16 in 2023. Indonesia's issues mainly concern the mycotoxin contamination of nutmeg. Egyptian exports to Europe mostly face issues with pesticides and salmonella.
